#### **COMMISSIONERS' REPORTS**

Commissioners commented on the public meeting about the DCNR Master Plan for Denton Hill State Park. Those in attendance expressed support for the state's plan, which includes upgrades to the ski lifts, snowmaking system and lodge, addition of four-season recreational facilities and more.

Commissioner Kefover shared some of the findings from her research for a Memorial Day speech. One trend of interest noticeable in a review of wartime fatalities and injuries over the years is a marked increase in disability claims.

Commissioner Heimel announced that he will be attending a meeting of the National Assn. of Counties Justice and Public Safety Committee, during which county officials will be making the case for increased federal funding to support county criminal justice reforms. Representatives from the White House, Justice Department and other federal agencies will meet with committee members.
