

Official Notice of Election for Military and Overseas Voters
County of Potter
2020 General Primary (April 28, 2020)

This is an official notice of a Primary election to be conducted on April 28, 2020 in Potter County. You may register to vote and request an official absentee ballot by using the Federal Postcard Application (FPCA), available at www.votespa.com or www.fvap.gov.

You may request an absentee ballot from this office at any time prior to a primary or election. However, if time does not permit you to receive and return an official absentee ballot, you are also entitled to vote using the Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot (FWAB). Military electors may also use the FWAB to register to vote and vote simultaneously.

You may use the FWAB to vote for a candidate for President of the United States and U.S. Representative (Representative in Congress) as well as candidates for all state and local offices, and ballot initiatives.

To vote, refer to page 3 of the FWAB.

To vote for President of the United States and U.S. Representative (Representative in Congress), write in the name of the candidate of your choice in the space provided on the FWAB.

To vote for state and local offices or for ballot initiatives, write the names of the candidates or ballot initiative in the Addendum section of the FWAB. Under the **Office/Ballot Initiative** heading, enter the office the candidate is running for or the title of the Ballot Initiative (referendum). Under the **Candidate Name, Party Affiliation or Initiative Vote** heading, list the name of the candidate you wish to vote for, or if you are voting on a Referendum questions write "yes" or "no".

In accordance with 25 P.S. 2606, 2866, and 3041 of the Pennsylvania Election Code notice is hereby given that at the ensuing General Primary to be held April 28, 2020 between the hours of 7:00 AM and 8:00 PM prevailing time in all of the various Election Districts of Potter County, nominations are to be made for the following public offices on the Democratic and Republican primary ballots:

PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES – Vote for One – All precincts within Potter County

ATTORNEY GENERAL – Vote for One – All precincts within Potter County

AUDITOR GENERAL – Vote for One – All precincts within Potter County

STATE TREASURER – Vote for One – All precincts within Potter County

REPRESENTATIVE IN CONGRESS – 12th Congressional District – Vote for One – All precincts within Potter County

SENATOR IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY – 25th Senatorial District – Vote for One – All precincts within Potter County

REPRESENTATIVE IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY – 67th Legislative District – Vote for One
(All precincts within Potter County EXCEPT for Galeton Wards 1 & 2, & Pike Township)

REPRESENTATIVE IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY – 68th Legislative District – Vote for One
(Galeton Wards 1 & 2, & Pike Township ONLY)

In addition to the above nominations for public offices, Delegates to the National Party conventions are to be ELECTED in the primary as follows:

Democratic Party

2 Male Delegates and 2 Female Delegates to the National Convention - 12th District

Republican Party

3 Delegates and 3 Alternate Delegates to the National Convention – 12th District

Republican Committeeman – Vote for One – All precincts within Potter County

Republican Committeewoman – Vote for One – All precincts within Potter County

Official Backup Ballot

Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot (FWAB)

Vote by writing the NAME or PARTY of the candidates you choose. To find out about specific candidates and races go to FVAP.gov.

Print clearly in blue or black ink.

Instructions

- This ballot can be used to vote for federal offices.
- DO NOT write your name or any identifying number (SSN, driver's license) on this ballot.
- Photocopy this page if you require additional room for candidates or ballot initiatives.
- If you are voting in American Samoa, Guam, Puerto Rico, or the U.S. Virgin Islands, you may vote for Delegate or Resident Commissioner, and in presidential primaries. State laws vary about using the FWAB for other offices like Governor or Mayor. Learn more online at FVAP.gov.
